MUDGEE vignerons the Dadds once sold their grapes to Southcorp but have now launched their own brand. A decade ago they planted 2ha of petit verdot, with the harvest formerly going into other brands medal-winning wine. Petit Verdot is robust but smoother yet still substantial in warmer Australian regions.

Optimiste 2007 Mudgee Chardonnay

PALE straw hues and melon and vanilla bean scents introduce this pleasant Mudgee chardonnay. The front palate displays white peach flavour and the middle palate brings forth creamy fig and crushed almond fruit elements and savoury oak. Smooth mineral-edged acid comes through at the finish. It would be good with blue cheese, caramelised onion and porcini tarts, chicken liver risotto or smoked cod in white onion sauce.

Walsh appropriately labelled this a 'dinner-table wine'. It just has that feeling about it - the edge of sophistication, the sense that it's more about drinking with food than by itself. It's a blend of cabernet, merlot and petit verdot, and they team beautifully here. Flavours of toast and mulberries and dark cherries, all nicely knitted together. Licoricey, dusty aftertaste.
